On behalf of the Flagstaff Unified School District (FUSD) staff and members of the Governing Board, I extend my appreciation to the voters of our community, who have demonstrated their support for education over several years by approving overrides and bond elections. The current \$20,790,000 Bond approved in November 2012 has been the bulk of the capital funding for FUSD from 2012-2018. The 15% Maintenance and Operations (M&O) Override renewed in November of 2014 has kept programs and services to students at an acceptable level during the past years and will again for school year 2018-2019. Through the approval of the overrides and bonds our District has continued to provide quality education for all of our students.

Great public schools are key to the success of our community, our economy, and the state of Arizona. It is essential that public education be operated with strong partnerships among schools, parents, and local communities in order to adequately prepare students to be our future leaders, caretakers, innovators and citizens. Elections, such as those cited above, are an opportunity for community members to express their beliefs and values. We are extremely proud and grateful that citizens of the Flagstaff community have continually demonstrated their support for public education. 

Frequently Asked Questions about Bond Revenues

**Q. What are the primary purposes for the bond money?**

A. Funds resulting from the passage of a bond are dedicated to renovating and maintaining district schools, with the goals of increasing safety, efficiency, and general support of District programs, services and school activities. The bond funds have also been the main source of funding to assure that students and staff have state of the art technology designed to foster the learning process and enhance career and college preparation. General enhancement to technology and use of those instructional resources in grades K-12 help develop student skills necessary for success in today's global marketplace and society. The bond funds have been the only source of funding for replacing an aging bus transportation fleet. In addition to refurbishing schools that are 30 to 70 years old, renovations have increased energy efficiency and allowed the District to install solar systems that generate significant general operating funds.

**Q. Why are School Bond Elections necessary?**

A. The bond program provides FUSD the maximum flexibility in having funds available for a variety of essential needs. The bond revenues best fill the vacuum of the several capital funds removed by the State in the past six years. The Building Renewal Fund and other capital funds have been underfunded in FUSD by \$30 million during the last nine years, and no funding for essential safety, deterioration, and inefficiency upgrades has been available from State sources. The State has cut the soft capital sources in the past years. These funds, used for basic instructional materials – textbooks, technology, software – were completely eliminated in the 2011-12 school year and thereafter. Yes, FUSD received \$0 in funding from the State for textbooks and technology for all school years from 2011-12 to 2017-18.

**Q. How do citizens know that FUSD has spent funds wisely and responsibly?**

A. Flagstaff Unified School District has a proven record regarding responsible stewardship of bond funds. The \$53.1 million 2006 bond revenues were well planned and utilized according to the commitments made to voters. The projects were completed on a timely basis and some of the projects were accomplished under estimated costs. Likewise, the 2012 bond in the amount of \$20,790,000 has been well planned and implemented to address essential security and safety issues along with essential repairs/refurbishments. A special report is made annually to the District's Governing Board concerning the utilization of these funds; additionally, a Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee meets monthly to review projects and costs and oversees the entire bond program.

**Q. Why are Arizona school districts in the position of asking voters for so much local support?**

A. Arizona has reduced funding to K-12 education by over \$2,200,000,000 in the past years and ranks 49<sup>th</sup> in the nation in per pupil spending. Following is the summary of reduced funding:

No Building Renewal last ten (10) years and an 85% reduction of Regular Capital.

Excess Utilities Provision totally removed for last ten (10) years.

Full Day Kindergarten funding eliminated last nine (9) years.

Soft Capital substantially reduced starting in FY 2010 and 100% reduced for larger districts in FY 2012.

### **Bond Oversight Committee**

The Bond Oversight Committee is made up of local Flagstaff-area voters. The members of the committee range from current and retired businessmen to past Governing Board Members, each member lending their expertise to the decision making process. The committee is appointed by the FUSD Governing Board.

Some items of upgrade and replacement were common throughout the District in utilizing 2012 bond funds. These areas of upgrade are summarized below under the categories of security, exterior, interior and technology. The listings by school sites and the dollars expended follow these overall summaries.

### Exterior

- Upgraded or replaced roof shingles as needed
- Upgraded gutters and downspouts as needed
- Added heat tape to all FUSD school site roofs
- Exterior siding and painting as needed
- Upgraded playgrounds, parking lots and student pick-up zones

### Interior

- Security entrances addressed at all schools
- Painted interior as needed
- Replaced interior acoustic and grid ceilings as needed
- Installed carpet as needed
- Replaced door hardware as needed for safety
- Upgraded/installed exit signage
- Upgraded interior lighting systems as needed for increased energy efficiency
- Upgraded bleachers at secondary schools

### Technology

- Upgraded WI-FI infrastructure and servers
- Installed platforms/carts of laptops for use in each classroom
