

# **Critical Thinking**

- Collect, assess, and analyze relevant information to make sound judgements and decisions.
- Identify, define, and solve authentic problems and essential questions.
- Have the courage to take risks and know how to develop, organize, and manage new ideas.
- Elaborate, refine, analyze, and evaluate own ideas in order to improve and maximize creative efforts.
- Demonstrate originality and inventiveness in work.



### Communication

- Articulate thoughts and ideas effectively using oral, written, and nonverbal communication skills in a variety of forms and contexts.
- Listen effectively to decipher meaning, including knowledge, values, attitudes, and intentions.
- Access information efficiently and effectively.
- Evaluate information critically and competently.
- Use digital technology and communication tools to manage, integrate, evaluate, and create information.



# **Empathy**

- Demonstrate awareness, concern, and respect to connect with others' feelings, opinions, experiences, and culture.
- Work effectively and respectfully with diverse teams.
- Learn from and work collaboratively with individuals representing diverse cultures, religions, and lifestyles in a spirit of mutual respect and open dialogue in personal, work, and community contexts.
- Assume a shared responsibility for collaborative work and value individual contributions made by each team member.
- Understand, negotiate, and balance diverse views and beliefs to reach workable solutions.
